San Francisco Civic Symphony

Peyton Manning. Mark Sanchez. Christine Page. These were three of the principle players facing off on January 24th. Who would prevail?

On an otherwise quiet Sunday afternoon, the Elks bar saw the New York Jets battle the Indianapolis Colts for the AFC Championship, while in the Grand ballroom next door the San Francisco Civic Symphony took on Dvorak, Griffes, and Lyadov. It was a continuation of a long Elks' tradition: bringing together Lodge members and the larger community to enjoy the performing arts. In this case, the art of football and classical music.

Both the bar and ballroom filled slowly at first. But eventually loyal football fans crowded in front of bartender Artie Penza and the flat screen TV, while music fans filled the more than 250 seats in the Grand ballroom.

The first to arrive for the Civic Symphony's concert program was the harpist. The large, impressive harp seemed small, even quaint, in the vast openness of the Grand ballroom. It looked more like a cherub's instrument—abandoned by a chubby angel from Michelangelo's Sistine chapel.

Under the masterful direction of Garret Gerritsen, the San Francisco Civic Symphony began their 2010 winter concert with "The Enchanted Lake" by Anatoly Lyadov. And as the maestro promised in his introduction to the piece, there were times when it was easy to imagine moonlight dancing on a watery surface.

The performance of Charles Tomlinson Griffes "Poem for Flute and Orchestra" was just that—poetic. Christine Page, the flute soloist, was so captivating it seemed as if the whole audience held its breath not wanting to miss a single note in the oak paneled ballroom. When a football fan yelled, "touch down" at the end of the piece, the audience clapped in complete agreement. It was the perfect punctuation to a sublime performance.

After the intermission the symphony rewarded those who managed to tear themselves away from a full bar and football game with a rousing performance of Antonin Dvorak's "Symphony No. 9". Part of Dvorak's New World symphony, it's a piece that gently lulls you with a serene Adagio. Then, as you begin to relax into a sense of calm the music rushes back with a massive wall of sound. The drums lead the charge in the Allegro con fuoco with every other instrument doing their best to keep up.

While the symphony played, Peyton Manning orchestrated an equally impressive performance. With a four-play scoring drive that lasted less than one minute he helped spark the Colts to a 30-17 win. As it turned out, two of the three performances prevailed that Sunday afternoon—the Indianapolis Colts and the San Francisco Civic Symphony.

Mission Family Center

Mission Family Center conducts an intensive therapeutic treatment program for emotionally disturbed children. The children, ages three through eighteen come from many ethnic backgrounds, whose families have limited financial and emotional resources. These children have suffered severe trauma in their lives, including physical and sexual abuse, neglect, loss, separation, and exposure to war. They are often depressed, withdrawn, aggressive, destructive to self and others.

Unable to attend school on a full-time basis, many of the children attend school in the morning and attend the center during the afternoon. Programs are geared to reach the children through individual, group, drama, recreational, and family therapy. A child will stay in the program an average of one and a half years. The goals are to help these children work through their pain and gain the strength necessary to succeed in school, at home and with friends.

Our Youth Activities Committee has been associated with Mission Family Center for over 25 years, providing financial support for programs and events, for the children and parents, that their limited budget would not otherwise permit. Jose Hipolito, Director of Activities Therapy and Volunteer Services is our liaison for the organization and has been very conscientious about keeping us informed about their activities.

Over the past several years, Jose, with volunteers and other professional workers, has brought many of the younger children to our Children's Halloween party. This is a great treat for them and they have thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Jose is an inspirational person, dedicated to the welfare of the children and their families in his charge. We are proud to have had this long standing association with this organization which provides such a vital community service. Please see the accompanying letter.

Dear Elks Members:

Greetings and Happy New Year from all of us at Mission Family Center. I want to start off by thanking you for your generous and continued support of our clinic.

As I thought about what to write in this letter, I went through our old letters, letters that had been written over the years from past staff at Mission Family Center to the Elks.

Reading these old letters put into perspective the long history that we have had. The earliest letters I found went back to 1984. In over twenty-five years of letters I found that the Elks made possible: entrance fees to the zoo, movies, and the Exploratorium, to name a few. Your organization paid for countless camping trips, and provided the funds to put on a "talent show" in 1987. The letters also describe the bowls, knives and other cutlery you purchased for us over the year. One of my favorite letters, written in the mid 1980's, while I was still a young kid in college, was written thanking you folks for the money to buy a Santa Claus suit for the clinic.

After going through some of these past letters, I decided to walk through the clinic, and into our storage area. A lot of the stuff we purchased with your help is still around. The Santa suit is holding up well, the knives are still cutting, and the two Christmas trees still keep the waiting area bathed in Christmas charm. It made me realize, "wow, what a long and shared history our two organizations have had!"

It's amazing to think that our agency serves hundreds of children per year and that you've been a partner in this for well over 25 years. That puts the Elks at having had a hand in helping thousands and thousands of children, just in our clinic. In our daily work with the children at Mission Family Center, your support is constantly felt.

We hear people saying "thank you" many times on a daily basis, but know that our "thank you" truly comes from the heart. We look forward to many more years of your support. Thanks again and bless you.

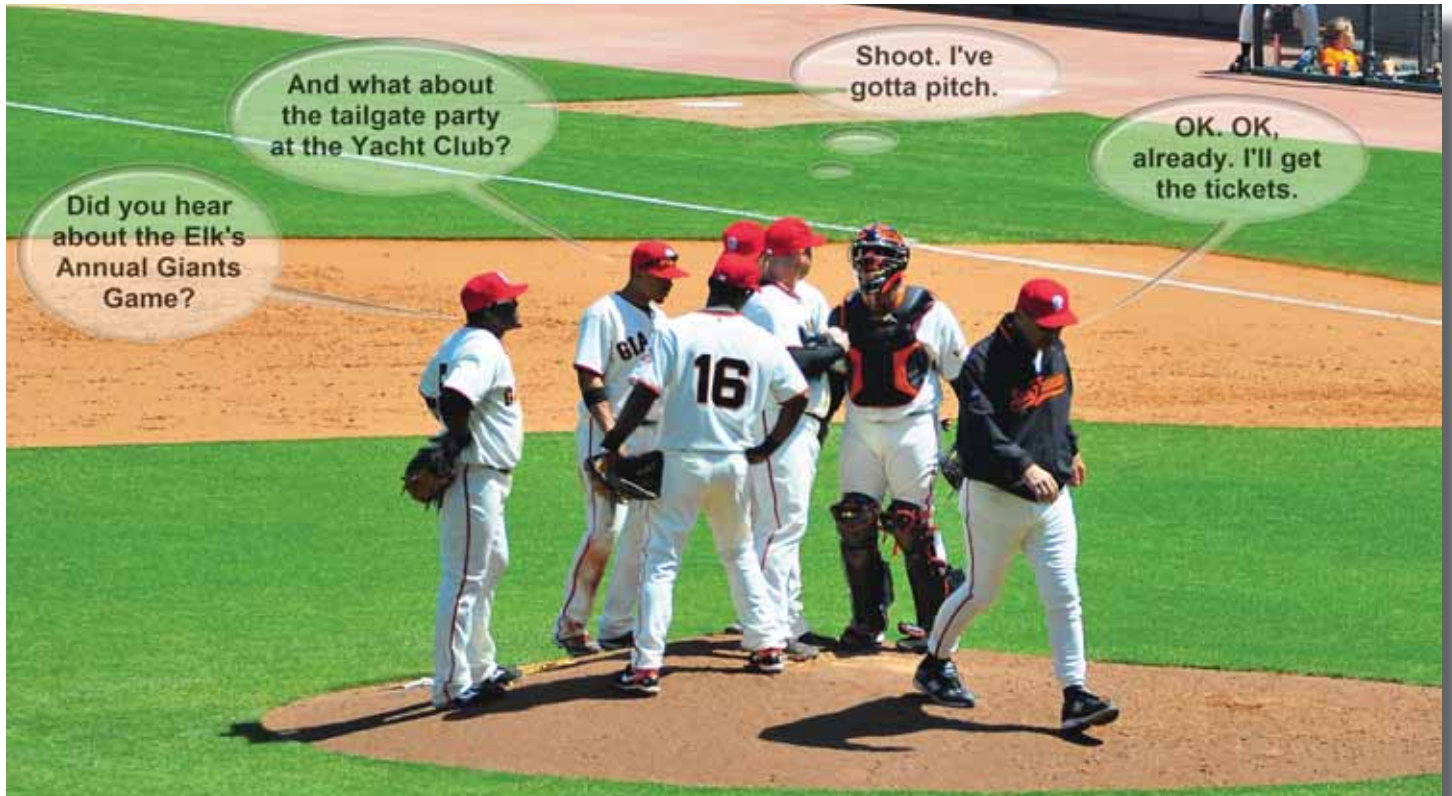
