## A Coin a Day and They'll Walk, Talk, See and Play

The California-Hawaii Elks Association (CHEA) recently celebrated over 50 years of service to the citizens of the States of California and Hawaii through their Major Project, dedicated to helping disabled children and their families. This program, which has helped thousands, covers three major areas: speech-language therapy, physical therapy, and preschool vision screening for children between three and five years old.

The Speech-Language Therapy program allows the Elks to provide a speech-language pathologist to children with disabilities such as cleft palate, hearing impairment, articulation disorder, language delay, stuttering, swallowing, or feeding disorders, which need therapy as a prerequisite for speech.

The Physical and Occupational Therapy programs provides in home physical and occupational therapists for children with disabilities such as cerebral palsy. In this program, children learn the basic life skills to become as independent and self-sufficient as they can be. These skills could be as simple as learning to use a straw, or as complex as learning to walk and talk.

The Preschool Vision program screens between 45,000 and 50,000 three to five year old's each year for hidden vision problems, which, if left undiscovered, might cost a child their site later in life.

In addition to these programs, CHEA has Disabled Student Scholarships to help those with disabilities continue their higher education. CHEA also supports hospital and clinics with grants to further their outreach into the community. Locally, Children's Hospital, Stanford, School for the

Blind, Berkeley, and the University of California San Francisco Children's Eye Clinic have received grants.

Each year CHEA choose one child as their theme child. This year's theme child is Delilah.



To say that Delilah had a difficult birth would be an understatement. She was born at 35 weeks with a multitude of complications that included, among others, gastroschisis, cholactasis, an enlarged liver, hypertension, and feeding problems. At three months she's had a respiratory arrest causing neurologic impairment. At five months she went home. Recently she was diagnosed with choreoathetoid cerebral palsy which is characterized by extreme uncontrolled movement of her body.

Delilah started receiving physical therapy with the Elks Major Project in February 2010 when she was two years old. She had eight therapy sessions at Children's Hospital in Fresno before beginning physical therapy in her home.

Delilah receives weekly physical therapy. When she started therapy, she was able to roll from stomach to her back, and back to her stomach. She could not sit for long periods of time, move herself into a sitting position by herself, or even crawl. Through the efforts of CHEA's dedicated personnel, Delilah gained strength and coordination. In November 2010 her new pink walker was delivered. She was able to stand almost immediately, but couldn't walk. Braces followed and soon she began to take a few steps. She's also learning to feed herself and drink from a cup. Amazing progress from a determine young child. That's what your coin a day buys. Thanks for your support.

It was at times a boisterous ceremony, with chiding between the officers and NCOs alike, as well as an opportunity for them all to reflect and honor their comrades who have been wounded or lost while in service to our nation. I feel privileged that our Lodge is able to provide a venue for these brave men and women, and I carry back their thanks to our entire Lodge for their continuing support, and for providing a venue for them.

These moments represent grand times to enjoy, but for me there is also a drive to keep moving forward and pressing on into new territory and challenges. *I would like to invite you to our annual art sale. It takes place here at the school and I'll send along a digital postcard reminder as the date gets closer.*

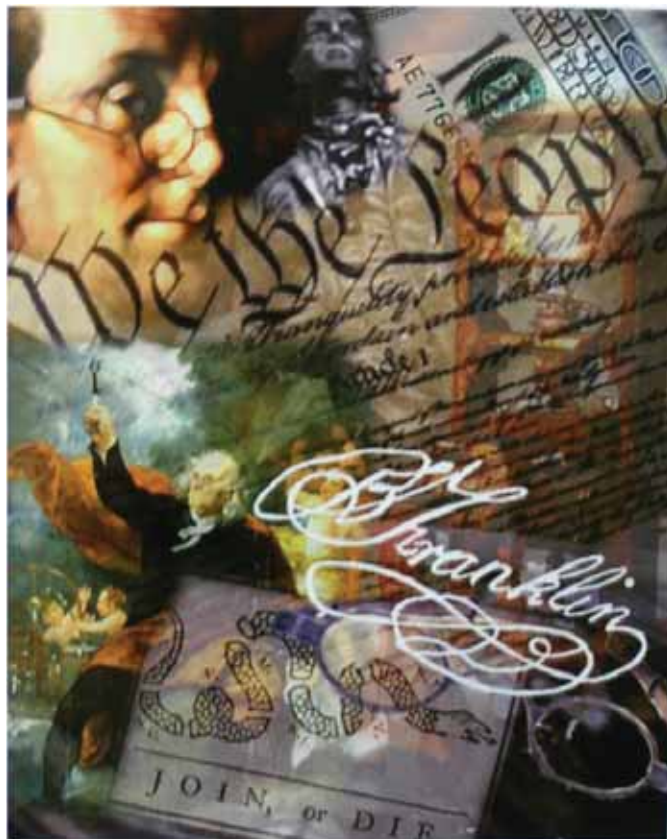
*Again, thank you all so very much.*

## **California-Hawaii Elks Association President Wayne Howard Biography**

Wayne Howard was born on September 27, 1934 in Gunter Texas, and attended public schools in Arlington Texas. After high school Wayne entered the US Navy in 1951. His tour of duty took him to many places in the Pacific including Hawaii, Japan, Philippines, South and North Korea, and China. Wayne served as a machinist mate on board his ship and was separated from active duty in 1955 to serve in the inactive naval reserve before being discharged in 1959.

After Wayne was separated from the Navy he worked at several different jobs in Texas, Oregon and California before returning to Texas where he went to work for Continental Baking Company, Wonder Bread and Hostess Cup Cakes in 1956. Wayne worked part time and returned to College majoring in Baking Science and Management from 1959 to 1962. In 1967 Wayne was asked by Continental Baking Company to move to Hawaii and manage the production Department for Love's Bakery, a Subsidiary of Continental Baking Company. During his time with Love's Wayne was active in the community as a member of the Environmental Management Association. He served two years as Secretary of the Hawaii Banana Association and two

years as its President. He started his own family bakery in 1977, Ono Cones of Hawaii making Ice cream cones. He sold his successful 31 year old company in 2008, and retired.

Wayne was asked to join the Elks in Kailua Hawaii Lodge No. 2230 and did so on December 2, 1969. Wayne became active and started through the chairs to be elected Exalted Ruler of Kailua Elks Lodge No. 2230 in 1975. He remained active in Kailua for several years chairing several committees and was Chairman of the Trustees in 1984.

Wayne became active in Honolulu Elks Lodge No. 616 and transferred his membership to Honolulu in June ~1989. He served on several committees including the Auditing Committee, one year as chairman. He also was elected to Treasurer where he served for two years. Wayne was elected to the Honolulu Lodge No. 616 Board of Trustees twice serving a total of 8 years and as its Chairman twice.

Wayne served the California-Hawaii Elks Association as Hawaii District Vice President in 1993-1994 and served as District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler for two years in 1994-1996. Wayne has served as Hawaii District Leader for over 15 Years and is an advisor from Hawaii to the Major Project Board. Wayne served on the California-Hawaii Elks Major Project Board of Trustees for six years, the last year as Chairman.

In 1996 Wayne met and married his wife, Coleen, who is an Elk. They met at Hilo Lodge No. 759 and she was a Leading Knight at that time. She went on to serve Hilo as Exalted Ruler twice and became Hawaii District Vice President in 2000-2001 and District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler for the Hawaii District in 2001-02. Wayne has two sons and one grandson. Coleen has a daughter, a son, two grandsons and a granddaughter.

During his year as President he will be promoting, "Elks Live Aloha". He has the expectation that Elks will continue to live with Aloha in their daily lives and spreading Aloha throughout their communities. "Elks Live Aloha"
