Richard Engelhardt, Chairman of the “Tom Schomburg Scholarship for Future Citizens” program, presented three awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$4,000.

Prior to presenting the “Paul Romano Special Achievement Award,” Bruno Pardini paid special tribute to our deceased Elk, Paul Romano for whom this program is named. Paul had served many years as Youth Activities and Scholarship chairman and has been an example to those who followed.

Applications, of those students which did not qualify for awards in either of the two aforementioned programs were reviewed again to search out special qualities of leadership.

From donations of members and friends we were able to make eight “Special Achievement” awards of \$500 each. To all those donors, and on behalf of the students and parents, please accept heartfelt thanks for your generosity.

Bruno Pardini was then asked to present two additional awards to one boy and one girl, coming from proceeds donated from the Bruno Pardini dinner and the Ladies Brunch. He was really caught off guard and surprised when he learned that the two extra scholarships of \$750 each were for the “Bruno Pardini Community Service Award”. We sincerely hope that we will be able to continue this award in the future and still have it presented by Bruno.

Two of the six students’ applications chosen for District judging advanced to the State level for further evaluation. We just learned that the two, Kevin C.K. La, Washington H.S. and Yvonne S. Chen, Lincoln H.S. will each receive State allocated awards of \$800. In the past we had at least one to two students advance to the National level for another round of judging but unfortunately that was not the case this year. Hopefully we will have one or more applications continue on to the National competition next year. There the competition is for one of seven awards which range from \$8,000 to \$60,000, and 482 Runners-Up awards of \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year for four years) by advancing to the National level. Thank you for your donations to the ENF program.

We congratulate all the participating students for their accomplishments and wish them much success as they proceed on their educational and life journey.

Sincere thanks to the volunteers and staff who helped make this another outstanding scholarship year. They truly embodied the Elk motto “Elk Care, Elks Share!” May God bless each and every one of you.

Lodge Maintenance

San Francisco Lodge No.3 broke ground on our current building in 1923. As buildings go, it's a grand old lady, but it's old and needs continuing and ongoing maintenance to stay that way. Over the last few years, discussions between the Lodge and our master lessor, TCC, have been fruitful in determining and designing the first-ever total building maintenance plan. In the past, building maintenance has been on an as-needed basis. That is, if it wasn't broken, it wasn't repaired. As many of our members continually and consistently pointed out, a long term plan that includes preventive maintenance is also required to protect our second-most valuable asset (obviously, our members are our "most" valuable asset). To that end, a plan is in place and the Lodge is implementing it. Before starting on the new plan, here are some of the maintenance highlights from the last year:

- A new dance floor was installed in the Lodge Room
- A new walk in cooler and ice maker behind the bar
- A new (and required by code) fire suppression system was installed in the kitchen
- A leak in the pool ceiling from the restaurant was fixed and a new ceiling installed
- New filters were installed in the pool
- The steam room was re-tiled
- A new 55" high-def big screen TV replaced the broken Sony XBR
- The gym got all new towels
- Over 500 pairs of men's trunks were purchased (where did they all go?)

And that was just last year. There are even more repairs planned for next .

The leak in the men's locker room in the gym is being fixed. As many members know, there's been an ongoing

and persistent leak in the ceiling of the men's locker room that's been much investigated and never fixed. Starting soon, maintenance crews will be demolishing the ceiling to finally determine and fix the leak.

The boiler for the steam room needs to be replaced at an estimated cost of \$30,000 dollars

The balcony is being restored to its former beauty. This restoration is in conjunction with repairs that are required to secure the safety of the building and the public walking below. So, instead of just "fixing" it, it will be restored to its former beauty. Check out some of the pictures of the old building and you'll see the beautiful terra-cotta work that was originally installed. This is the largest project the Lodge has tackled since the remodeling for the Farallon Restaurant will be started and completed this year.

Needless to say, while last year was expensive (over \$45,000 dollars in repairs and maintenance to the gym alone), this year will be even more so. So, even though we get a good portion of the money we spend for these projects back as "common area maintenance" fees, the Lodge still has a significant outlay for many months before partial reimbursement is received. For that reason, gym fees, which haven't been raised in over five years, will be seeing a modest increase. There will also be fund raising programs for the balcony. The "Build a Brick" program, which supports the balcony project with customized engraved terra-cotta bricks that will be an integral part of the balcony, will be kicking off soon.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact any member of the Board of Trustees or Building Association. They have been diligent in negotiating the maintenance programs and contracts that will keep our most prized possession in tip top shape for the next century.
