## Family and Community Through Soccer

The San Francisco Elks and the San Francisco Nighthawks Women's Soccer Team recently celebrated their third consecutive first place finish in the Silver Mug Women's Soccer Tournament in Las Vegas.

The San Francisco Nighthawks Women's Soccer Team, a non-profit group of volunteers who also love to play soccer, have partnered with the Elks over the last five years on many projects including:

- The Elks Soccer Shoot, which this year had over 130 kids participating
- The Elks Blood Drive, where 12 to 15 Nighthawks players have donated blood on a regular basis
- The Purple Pig (players contribute their change at weekly practices)

The Nighthawks were founded in 1993 by our Brother Elk Richard Cross with the objective of providing high quality soccer to young women who wanted to continue playing after their high school and college playing days. The Nighthawks have provided the opportunity to play to more than 300 young women, and have provided some wonderful examples of out reach into our community.

The players know the importance of their being members, and family, of the Nighthawks and especially the unique affiliation they have with the Elks.

Kristina Hall was provided the opportunity to play at the University of San Francisco because of introductions by the Nighthawks. In both her Junior and Senior years she earned the position of Team Captain.

Angela Martinez, who starred in Marin, and was named the Marin Player of the Year, also earned a spot on the Mexican National Team through her association with the Nighthawks.

And, in addition, the Nighthawks recently sponsored two foster children.

The Elks support the Nighthawks because they recognize the good the team does in the youth community. The team provides clinics and camps to under served, low-income kids and, as role models, gives them examples of what is possible. The concept of "family" is very strong and the team creates an atmosphere in which:

- 98% of the players graduate from college
- 85% coach youth teams
- 100% are involved in community service.

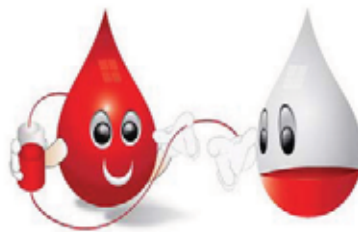

# Bequests and Living Trusts Corner

Dear BLT Chairman,  
I keep hearing about a Living Trust.  
What is it and what does it do?  
Thanks, ElkMama3



Dear ElkMaMa3,

One of the main objectives of a Living Trust is to avoid Probate. You see, at the moment of your death all the assets in “your name” are subject to the California Probate Court process. For most people, this means a long Court process (approximately 1 year) and substantial fees before your kids receive their inheritance. So what many people do to avoid the California Probate Court process is create a Living Trust. If you create a Living Trust now, take all of your assets out of “your name” and put them into your Living Trust’s name, there generally will be no assets left in “your name” at the moment of your death. Accordingly, there will be no Probate Court time lag or fees because Probate only applies to assets in “your name.”

Your Living Trust, which now holds all of your assets, on the other hand is not subject to Probate. After your death, the trustee of your Living Trust immediately starts the process of giving away your assets. This is how a Living Trust avoids the time lag and fees associated with the California Probate Court process.
