### Bruno Pardini



*World War II, Staff Sargeant US Army Air Corp*

I served 27 days short of three years during WWII in the Army Air Corp, where I attained the rank of Staff Sgt, in charge of four men in Supply Squadron. Our unit was responsible for keeping records of aircraft parts for B17 Flying Fortress and providing reports to commanders as needed.

The B-17's primarily were employed by the United States Army Air Corps in the daylight precision strategic bombing campaign of World War II against German industrial and military targets. This aircraft was a potent, long-range bomber that was able to defend itself, and to return home despite extensive battle damage.

I was glad to be serving my country during this period, as were so many others at that time, in various branches of the service. This time in the service provided me numerous lasting friendships and an opportunity to see another part of the world while visiting in England, Scotland and Wales.

Guess you could say that I "never had it so good".

*Persian Gulf*



*1st Infantry Division, 2nd Brigade "Dagger Brigade", 1-77th Armor Regiment "Steel Tigers"*

My military service has been an intrinsic part of my life that cannot be excoriated. Its who I am, and for me it never felt like a decision to join the Army. I believe 9/11 had a profound effect on all Americans.

I joined the military after we invaded Afghanistan, as I saw this as my war to fight for our country. I served in Iraq, in the Sunni Triangle, during the start of the insurgency. I was there for the transfer of power from the American forces to the Iraqis and I was there for the Iraqis' first democratic vote in over half a century.

After leaving military service every opportunity that has opened up for me has been partially credited to my time in the Army. It has paid for my college, provided me medical coverage, got me into job interviews, and got me into the Elks!

Just as my countrymen are grateful for my service I am grateful to my country for the services she has provided me. Service to me means repayment for all this country has afforded me and all that I am willing to give, including my life, to defend.

*Desert Storm/Desert Shield*



*175th Ranger Battalion*

I joined the Army in 1983 when I decided, after a less than stellar high school career, that I just wasn't ready for college. I had always loved dogs and wanted to become a dog handler. In the Army, that meant joining as a Military Policeman, and making the rank of E-4 before you could apply for the Dog Handler's

Trainer's course in San Antonio.

Before going to dog training school, I was first attached to the 175th Ranger Battalion in Savannah, GA. Essentially that meant that I spent about 10 of my 15 months in the "field" on various training deployments. Each platoon of my MP company was attached to a company of Rangers. I spent lots of time in both the Mojave Desert in Southern California and even did a

training deployment to the Sinai Desert. (Egypt)

I also did a tour of duty in Nuernberg, Germany before I was accepted into Dog Training School. In Germany I was assigned to a Law Enforcement MP Company. The experience not only cemented the fact that I personally didn't want a career in law enforcement after I left the military, but it also taught me a great deal of respect for the job those who do choose that vocation.

After school I was sent back to Germany where I did a 3 year tour in Fulda that was extended for 7 extra months because of Desert Shield/Storm, then, after 8 years, I decided it was time to get out.

My time in the military matured me, and I went from a High School student who did just enough to graduate (at the bottom 1/3 of my class) to a straight A student in College on the Dean's List. I was majoring in Political Science, with the goal of eventually going to Law School, and working in various jobs, when I had the opportunity to put my military training to use working with dogs.

That lead to starting my own business, in 1992, which I loved, and after juggling my business and school for a year, I decided that I preferred working for myself to what being a lawyer seemed to hold for me, and I left school to concentrate on my own business.

The leadership skills I learned in the military (during my second tour in Germany, in addition to being a Dog Handler, I was the NCOIC of security at an Air Defense Missile site, responsible for a 100+ member enlisted guard force as well as the security of all of the tactical missiles, ammunition, and weapons on the missile site where I was assigned) along with the instructor skills I learned allowed me to start what turned out to be the largest dog training company in the Western United States.

Now I have a vocational school teaching others to start and run their own dog behavior training businesses. I'm sure that none of the success I have enjoyed would have been possible without the experiences and maturity I gained while serving in the Army.

The Elks Gym welcomes all Elks members to the gym facility. You do not need to have a gym membership to use the gym. As a San Francisco Elk member, or visiting Elk member, in good standing, you are entitled to use the gym for a day fee of only \$10. This one-day pass includes the use of two (2) towels, a pair of shorts and a locker, along with the enjoyment of all the gym amenities. With

a 25-meter pool, a one of kind steam room, a hot room, a cedar sauna, cardio room, weight room, handball courts, pool tables, large screen TVs, and a lounge, consider this a gym as well as a spa.

We all know how important it is to work out and stay in good physical shape. But, if crowded overpriced gyms aren't for you, or you are tired of carrying around sweaty gym clothes, then it is time to check out the San Francisco Elks gym. The gym is open from 6am-10pm M-S and 7am-10pm on Sunday. On an average day, 75 people use the gym facility. With the expansive hours and many gym/spa options, you never hear the words "are you done using that machine;" nor is it necessary to sign up for a lane in the pool. Not up for a workout – the gym offers a tranquil atmosphere for a steam or a little R&R.

The Lodge would like to thank the current gym members, including those members who do not use the gym regularly but maintain their gym membership. The membership fee for the gym (currently (\$440 per year), is very important, and helps to keep the facility operational. When calculating the yearly gym budget, the House Committee seriously considers current gym membership levels. While the equipment and the entire facility are always well maintained, the costs of upgrading and adding new equipment are dependent on the allotted yearly gym budget. As such, the Lodge would like to see an increase in gym membership.

While it is true that most people join the San Francisco Elks Lodge for the gym, there are still many of you who have not experienced why this is true. Come on down and see for yourself what the San Francisco Elks gym/spa has to offer!
