## Lodge No. 3 Packs It In

The call went out, volunteers needed. Eddie Cooke started the call. It spread to the gym and the bar. Soon it was published in the bulletin. And San Francisco Lodge No. 3 responded. On September 11 twenty brothers and sisters gathered at the San Francisco Food Bank to volunteer as sorters of food earmarked for distribution to those in need. During our two hour shift, we sorted 10,500 pounds of pairs donated by local growers. Consider that that's approximately 116 pounds a minute, and you'll get a sense of how hard they were working.

These pairs were scheduled to be delivered to San Francisco's Schools, Churches and Hospitals on Monday the 12th. The Bank receives many donations of this kind that are identified by producers as unmarketable, but are still fresh and nutritious. The food bank employs a staff of 40 at its Pennsylvania Avenue location. As a result of recent federal budget cuts, the Bank relies heavily on corporate and private donations of both time and money. ## From the Gym Corner

The Elks Gym is a private club, so please respect your fellow members. By following the simple protocol set forth below, we can all make the Elks Gym a cleaner, safer and better place for all members.

### Personal Items:

Among the many benefits of being a member of the Elks Gym is the use of a personal locker. Gym members who decide to cancel their gym membership are required to inform the Secretary's office. At that time, it is the member's responsibility to clean out the locker and let the gym attendant know that the locker has been vacated.

In the event a member gives up gym membership, but does not give up possession of the locker, the lock will be removed and the personal belongings placed in a bag and held in the gym office. Over the past few years the Lodge has accumulated massive amounts of personal belongings left behind by past members. Neither the Elks Lodge, nor the gym management, is responsible for maintaining/storing your personal items.

If you are a past gym member and think that you may have

personal items in your locker, please stop by the gym and one of the Elks gym attendants will assist you in locating your belongings. We will continue to store your items until December 1, 2011. After that time, all items will be donated to charity.

### Guest Pass Policy:

Gym members are entitled to guest passes which can be used to bring potential new members, or personal guests, to the gym. However, a guest can only be allowed access with a guest pass three (3) times. After the third visit using a guest pass, the member is required to pay a \$10.00 guest fee for that person. The Lodge encourages new membership, but they do not encourage abuse of the guest pass privilege. A guest must be accompanied by a gym member; either when using a guest pass or paying the \$10.00 guest fee.

### Personal Trainers:

Personal trainers are considered guests. If a member would like to bring a personal trainer to assist in their workout, the member will be required to pay the guest fee of \$10.00 per visit. If you have any questions about any of the equipment, ask the gym attendant and they would be more than happy to assist you.

## District Deputy Lynn Glick Visits San Francisco Lodge No. 3

Ms. Lynn Glick, DDGER, and her Officer corps conducted her annual visit and review of San Francisco Lodge No. 3 in September.

Lynn's visit included both the standard Grand Lodge inspection which reviews at how the Lodge is performing against Grand Lodge rules and regulations, and a report by Lodge committees, which is also reported back to Grand Lodge. Ms. Glick then enjoyed a dinner in her honor before watching San Francisco's Officers perform in initiation ritual.

During the Lodge meeting that followed, Lynn addressed the members assembled and reviewed what she would be reporting back to Grand Lodge.

Lynn was impressed with a number of San Francisco Lodge No. 3's programs, but made special mention of Youth Activities, Scholarships, and our work with Veterans. She closed by noting that the San Francisco Officer Corps, which placed second in the District Ritual Competition in April, had performed an "exemplary rendition" for her visit.



# Scholarship News

Students are back in school and many high school seniors will be busy applying for scholarships to college. This is a good time for our members to become acquainted with some Elk sponsored scholarship programs which are currently available.

## ENF Most Valuable Student Scholarship

Any high school senior who is a resident of San Francisco and a U.S. citizen is eligible to apply. Seniors living outside of San Francisco must apply to the Lodge nearest



their home. Applications are presently being distributed to the San Francisco high schools. Through a standardized judging process that evaluates scholarship, leadership, and financial need, each Lodge selects their top six applicants (three boys and three girls) for advancement to the next level of judging at the District and then possibly to the State and National levels.

Over the years we've had an outstanding number of students applying through our Lodge who have gone on to win State and National awards.

Actually, during the initial judging process at our Lodge, we select the top six boys and top six girls and, at our annual Scholarship Awards dinner, these students will receive cash awards ranging from \$600 to \$1,100.

Applications of those students who did not move on to the District level are again judged for special Lodge awards. The Paul Romano Special Achievement awards in the amount of \$500 come from YOUR scholarship donations during the year. Two Bruno Pardini Community Service awards were instituted last year in the amount of \$750 each, honoring Bruno's many years of service to BPOE #3 Lodge and the community at large.

## Tom Schomburg Scholarship for Future Citizens

This is our own Lodge sponsored program for San Francisco high school seniors who are not yet U.S. citizens and,

therefore, not eligible for the ENF scholarship contest. The criterion used for evaluating these applications is similar to that used for the ENF Most Valuable Student Scholarship program. The top three students selected will receive cash awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$4,000. Applications for this program are also being distributed at the same time as the ENF applications.

## Legacy Awards for Children/Grandchildren of Elks

Any child or grandchild (or stepchild, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2009, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2009, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2012.

The applicant must be a high school senior and must apply through the related member's Elks Lodge, regardless of where the applicant resides. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elks members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge. 2012 Legacy Awards application will be available ONLINE ONLY starting September 1, 2011. By this brief overview we want to make you aware of the opportunities that are available. If the right situation presents itself, you could be instrumental in steering a worthy student towards one of these programs. The deadline for submission of applications for any of these programs is Friday, December 2, 2011. Though that may seem far off, it really isn't. Students are involved with so many things at this time of the year and that date rolls around very quickly. It is important that they get started early.
